SIAMS Inspection

On Wednesday 1st December we are welcoming a Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) inspector into our school. Around every five years, schools are subject to an inspection which explores the question, "How effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?" It will focus on the impact of the Church school's Christian vision on pupils and adults. This involves looking at the school's Christian vision, the provision the school makes because of this vision and how effective this provision is in enabling all pupils to flourish.

This gives us an opportunity to show what we do really well at St. Peter's, where we truly are, 'Sowing the seeds of tomorrow'.

Celebration Worship

Each Friday, we celebrate the children's achievements in our KS1 and KS2 Celebration Worship. It can be disappointing for children if they don't receive a badge during this Worship, therefore we ask that all badges are returned to school on Thursday each week, so that they can be presented to children during the celebration on Fridays.
